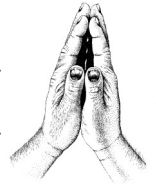

KENYA... Galana – Eddie and Mary Dorrans have arrived back in Kenya to continue supervising the building of a second footbridge across the Galana River. Work on the bridge stopped for several months during the rainy season. Eddie and Mary join Derek and Linda Roulston in Kisima to prepare and cut the wood for the decking for the second bridge. Eddie will also visit the Nanyuki Girls' Secondary to discuss the building of the new school. ▪ *Pray for safe and trouble-free travel for Eddie and Mary and remember them over the next few weeks as they settle back into their home in Malindi.* ▪ *Pray for the preparation for the next stage of construction of the second footbridge, that it will progress well and for good health and safety for all involved in the construction work.* ▪ *Pray too for teams from Ireland who are preparing to go to Galana to help out with the building of the bridge.* ▪ *Pray for the finalising of plans for the building of Nanyuki Girls' Secondary School and that preparation for the building work will get underway.*

KENYA... Tuum – Stephen Cowan reports that it is getting very hot and dry, yet there is still some grass and some milk at the homesteads. The monthly adult Bible teaching time has just finished and there are encouraging signs of growth! There was an increased interest among people of Tuum and many young men attended in the evenings. Sadly there are many girls getting pregnant at a young age. The local Elders are accepting that indiscipline has to be dealt with, which PCEA is known to do. There has not been any changes in the leadership at PCEA Tuum Girls' Secondary School (TGSS), however, a new Board of Governors has been selected and they plan to meet on 3rd February in Tuum. ▪ *Give thanks for good attendance at the monthly Bible teaching time in Tuum and pray that those who attended will grow in their knowledge of and love for God.* ▪ *Pray that Christians will be good witnesses.* ▪ *Pray for wise decisions to be made at the TGSS Board of Governors meeting.*

BMO SPECIALIST SERVICE AGENCIES – SAT-7 broadcast a New Year's worship service from Tahrir Square in Cairo live to millions of people. During and long after the event, praise, prayer and words of hope were on the lips of Egyptians - and many others across the Middle East and North Africa!
